WATER AND SEWER INFORMATION

This document is a guide to help inform new water and sewer users, with existing services, in the City of Bellevue. The City of Bellevue has two main ordinances governing the use of municipal water and sewer. There are a few other ordinances that have been put in place to update these ordinances. The Sanitary Sewer Ordinance no. 2010-07 and the Water System Ordinance no.2010-06 can be found on the city website, Bellevuedaho.us or it can be picked up at City Hall at 115 E. Pine Street.

Our sanitary sewer and water system are maintained, repaired and updated through the fees collected from the users of our system. These fees are individual to each system and are enterprise funds.

Meaning that the use of those funds is only for those systems.

IRRIGATION RESTRICTIONS:

Between May 1st and September 30th, the sprinkling or watering of outdoor plantings such as grass, lawns, gardens, ground cover, shrubbery, trees or other landscaping shall be restricted upon all properties with even numbered street addresses to even numbered calendar days. With odd numbered properties being restricted to odd numbered calendar days. Properties will also be prohibited from sprinkling or watering between the hours of ten o'clock (10:00) a.m. till eight o'clock (8:00) p.m.

There are exceptions, upon written request made by the water user the city's authorized agent may grant an exception to these restrictions. This will be for the purpose of sprinkling or watering new plantings for a specified amount of time.

Sprinkling or watering by commercial nurseries on their own sites are specifically excluded from these restrictions and prohibitions.

Using water conservation irrigation devices such as drip or bubbler-style irrigation system that minimize water evaporation losses have an exception also.

Backflow prevention devices and permits:

Irrigation lines shall have a backflow device approved by the water superintendent and in conformance of IDAPA 58.01.08.543 and the adopted International Plumbing Code and shall be installed and maintained. No person shall install any such line onto a private water service without first receiving a permit from the City.

Water service valve operation:

Water service valve operation shall only be performed by the City. Water users who need water service to be turned off or on, they shall contact the water and sewer clerk, at [208-788-2128 ext. 1](tel:208-788-2128), to schedule it.

Water users shall give at least 24-hour notification, unless emergency conditions exist (i.e. an active water leak). There is a fee associated with this service.

RIGHT TO ENTER PREMISES FOR INSPECTION:

The Water Superintendent or otherwise authorized agent of the City bearing proper credentials and identification shall have the right to enter upon any premises connected with any public water system at all reasonable hours for the purposes of inspection, observation, measurement, sampling and/or testing to determine compliance with the provisions of the Water System Ordinance.

UNPOLLUTED WATER NOT PERMITTED IN SEWER SYSTEM:

It shall be unlawful for any person to place, deposit or discharge or cause to be to be placed, deposited or discharged any storm water, groundwater, roof runoff, subsurface drainage, cooling water, or other unpolluted water to any sanitary sewer without having received prior written permission from the Sewer Superintendent to take such action.

PROHIBITED DISCHARGES:

Except as hereinafter provided, no person shall place, deposit or discharge or cause to be placed, deposited or discharged any of the following described substances or wastewater containing the same to the Wastewater Collection and Treatment System.

1. Any gasoline, fuel oil or any flammable or explosive liquid, solid or gas or any solid, liquid, or gas which may, by themselves or by interaction with other substances, cause fire or explosive hazards or in any other way be injurious to person, property or the operation of the Wastewater Collection and Treatment System.
2. Any noxious or malodorous solids, liquids, or gases which either singly or by interaction with other substances are capable of creating a public nuisance or hazard to life or preventing entry into sewers for their maintenance or repair.
3. Any solids, greases, waxes, slurries, or viscous material of such character or in such quantity that it, in the opinion of the Sewer Superintendent, may cause an obstruction to the flow in the sewer, or otherwise interfere with the proper functioning of the Wastewater Collection and Treatment System.
4. Any toxic substance, chemical elements, or compounds in quantities sufficient to impair the operation or efficiency of the Wastewater Treatment Facilities and cause the effluent thereof to exceed the allowable loading limits per IDEQ Wastewater Land Application Permit (WLAP).
5. Any liquids having a PH lower than 5.5 or higher than 9.0 or having any corrosive property capable of causing damage or hazards to structures, equipment, or personnel of the Wastewater Collection and Treatment Systems.
6. Any radioactive isotopes unless found to be naturally occurring.

7. Any liquid or vapor having a temperature greater than one hundred forty degrees Fahrenheit (140 F).
8. Any garbage that has not been properly ground.
9. Any ashes, cinders, sand, mud, straw, shavings, metal, glass, rags, feathers, tar, plastics, wood, paunch manure, hair or other material capable of causing obstruction to the flow in sewers or other interference with proper operation of the Wastewater Collection and Treatment System.
10. Any liquid from roof down spouts, exterior foundation drains, area way drains, or other sources of surface runoff or groundwater.
11. Materials which exert or cause unusual concentrations of inert suspended solids (such as, but not limited to, Fullers earth, lime slurries, and lime residues) or of dissolved solids (such as, but not limited to, sodium chloride and sodium sulfate; or, excessive discoloration (such as, but not limited to, dye wastes and vegetable tanning solutions); or, unusual BOD, biochemical oxygen demand, or disinfection requirements in such quantities as to constitute a significant load on the sewage treatment works; or, unusual volume of flow or concentration of wastes.
12. Waters or wastes containing substances which are not amenable to treatment or reduction by the sewage treatment processes employed or are amenable to treatment only to such degree that the sewage treatment plant effluent cannot meet the requirements of other agencies having jurisdiction over discharge to the ground water and land applications sites.
Any water or waste containing fats, wax, grease, or oils, whether emulsified or not, in excess of one hundred five (105) mg/l or containing substances which may solidify or become viscous at temperatures between thirty-two (32) and one hundred forty (140) degrees F, (0 and 65 degrees C).
13. Any waters or wastes containing strong acid iron pickling wastes, or concentrated plating solutions whether neutralized or not.
Any waters or wastes containing iron, chromium, copper, zinc, or similar objectionable or toxic substances; or wastes exerting any excessive disinfection requirement, to such degree that any such material received in the composite sewage at the sewage treatment works exceeds the limits established by the City for such materials.
14. Any substance, material or waste which in the reasonable opinion of the City can harm the sewerage collection and treatment system, or sewage treatment process or any portion or part thereof or may have an adverse effect on any permit or license granted to the City therefore, or can otherwise endanger health, safety and welfare or constitute a nuisance.

APPROVAL REQUIRED FOR SPECIAL WASTEWATER DISCHARGE TO SYSTEM:

Approval for special wastewater discharges may be required in writing prior to any person discharging or causing the discharge into the public sewers. An inspection will be made with new business licenses to inspect any possible special discharges.

SEWER SERVICE LINE MAINTENANCE:

All sewer users shall keep their individual sewer service lines in good repair and condition so that said lines shall function properly and do not allow detectable amounts of groundwater to enter into the sewer system.
