2025 Year in Review

In 2025, the Bellevue Fire Department responded to 117 fire calls, compared to 119 in 2023, reflecting a 1.68% decrease in fire-related incidents.



Financially, we remained within budget for the year and finished under budget by \$27,311, with no budget overruns.

Wildland fire activity in 2025 was almost nonexistent. We responded to only one late-season wildland fire north of Ketchum.



We responded to 53 motor vehicle accidents (MVAs) in 2025, compared to 35 in 2023, representing a 34% increase in MVAs. As always, please be mindful and cautious while driving
