Minutes

6:00 p.m. Call to Order:

Mayor Burns called the Meeting to order. A roll call attendance was conducted, and Council members present were Doug Brown, Tammy Davis, Kathryn Goldman, Greg Cappel, Shaun Mahoney and Mike Choat. A quorum was present for the entire meeting. Staff present were Greg Beaver, Fire Chief; Frank Suwanrit, Public Works Director; Jason Calhoun, Street Supervisor; and Marian Edwards, City Clerk/Treasurer.

Notice and Hearing Compliance:

The posting of this meeting agenda complied with Idaho Code 67-2343. The meeting agenda was posted at the Bellevue Post Office, the bulletin board outside City Hall and on the website on November 20, 2019. Goldman motioned that the notice was in compliance with Idaho Code 67-2343. Davis seconded. All in favor. The motion passed.

2. Public Comment for Items of Concern not on the Agenda.

Goldman noted that she worked with Edwards to submit a grant proposal for approximately \$7500 to the Idaho Community Foundation to improve Bellevue's 2020 census participation. Grant recipients will be announced in mid-December.

Davis requested that a community planning discussion item be added to each Common Council agenda. Davis requested that the Council receive updates as to the Planning and Zoning Commissions' recommendations for Area of City Impact activities, including the Airport, as well as updates regarding Transfers of Development Rights in the City's Comprehensive Plan. Davis requested that the updates be agenda items.

Burns asked if Public Works was ready for the upcoming snowstorm and staff confirmed that they were.

Staff requested a departmental coding change for an expense from information previously

provided and the Treasurer agreed to do same. Davis motioned to accept the consent agenda as corrected. Cappel seconded. Roll call vote results: Davis- yes, Brown- yes, Cappel- yes, Goldman- yes, Choat- yes, Mahoney- yes. Motion passed.

#### NEW BUSINESS

4. Acceptance of the November 5, 2019 City of Bellevue Election Results Received from Blaine County. Marian Edwards, City Clerk/Treasurer. Edwards provided the Blaine County Commissioners canvassed official reports of the November 5, 2019 election results reflecting that Kathryn Goldman, Shaun Mahoney and Chris Johnson were elected for the three (3) open two-year Alderman terms beginning January 2020. The detailed results were:

Kathryn Goldman:	225 Votes
Shaun Mahoney:	221 Votes
Chris Johnson:	208 Votes

Brown motioned to accept the Bellevue election results. Mahoney seconded. Roll call vote results: Davis- yes, Brown- yes, Cappel- yes, Goldman- yes, Choat- yes, Mahoney- yes. Motion passed.


5. Discussion on Code Enforcement Options. Alderman Doug Brown. The Common Council discussed consistent code enforcement to make the City streets have a better physical appearance to entice more real estate transactions and economic development as well as increasing public safety. The Council discussed that residents needed more outreach as to City code regarding not parking or having personal property in the right of way. Staff noted that notices regarding same have included in water/sewer invoices since early fall. The Council asked questions regarding current infraction fees, departmental responsibility to ticket or tag offenders and staff responded. Staff noted that Advance Towing has a contract with Marshal's office to tow vehicles. The Common Council asked questions about the rules on alleys. Staff noted that nothing is supposed to be stored in the alleys, including snow piles and noted that continued outreach needed to be made to remind residents. Burns directed the Public Works staff to start a street by street effort immediately to reach out to offenders by placing flyers on vehicles or other items in the City right of way to have them moved. Public Works staff was directed to work with Ashley Dyer to make an announcement on the City's Facebook page to let followers know about prohibitions of having vehicles or items in the right of way. Brown recommended that the City have a welcome program for new businesses moving into the City.
6. Executive Session. There was no executive session.

7. Adjournment. Goldman motioned to adjourn. Brown seconded. All in favor. The motion passed and the meeting adjourned at 6:45pm.
