Special Meeting Minutes

**10:02a.m. Call to Order:**

Mayor Burns called the Special Meeting to order. A roll call attendance was conducted, and Council members present were Kathryn Goldman, Tammy Davis, Greg Cappel, Chris Johnson, Doug Brown, and Shaun Mahoney all appearing by teleconference. For the record, Mayor Burns and Clerk/Treasurer Edwards were physically present in the official meeting location of the Council Chambers of City Hall. A quorum was present for the entire meeting. Staff present were Greg Beaver, Fire Chief; Diane Shay, Community Development Director; Mynde Heil, Assistant Marshal; and Marian Edwards, City Clerk/Treasurer.

**Notice and Hearing Compliance:**

The posting of this special meeting agenda complied with Idaho Code 74-204. The special meeting notice and agenda was posted more than twenty-four (24) hours prior to the meeting at the Bellevue Post Office, the bulletin board outside City Hall and on the website on July 14, 2020. Goldman motioned that the notice was in compliance with Idaho Code 74-204. Davis seconded. All in favor. The motion passed.

1. Call for Conflict as outlined in Idaho Code §59-703 (f) – 704 With Any Agenda Item.  
Burns called for conflict from any Alderman with any agenda items. No conflicts were noted.
2. Public Comment for Items of Concern not on the Agenda.  
There were no public comments.

**NEW BUSINESS**

3. Consideration of Public Health Emergency Order 2020-04 of the City of Bellevue: Establishing Standards for Face Coverings for Individuals When They are in Public Places. Burns gave a brief overview of the history of this process. Goldman noted that South Central District Health has noted that the COVID19 virus is spreading and that contact tracing has been problematic. Burns opened the meeting for public comment. Andy Keeter, Tatyana Gray, Florence Blanchard, Jared Murphy, Dorothy Schinella, David Patrie, Michele Minailo, Evan Stelma, Commissioner Jacob Greenberg and Anita Tiggart gave public comments. Burns closed public comment.

The Alderman discussed the order. Brown gave a recap of the past two weeks and noted that the virus knows no boundaries. Davis noted that the Council needs to take care of the community. Johnson noted that he does not support the order as it does not give enough guidance and the added that the order would affect those County residents within five miles of Bellevue. Mahoney reiterated that Bellevue makes its own decisions and wants to keep his business open- the order would make it easier to enforce mask wearing. Cappel noted that his position is unchanged, wants the mask order. Goldman noted that she had received lots of

emails and that the order needed to be done. Burns noted that wearing masks give us the best shot at a normal summer.

Goldman motioned to adopt Public Health Emergency Order 2020-04 as presented. Davis seconded. Roll call vote results: Mahoney-yes, Goldman- yes, Davis- yes, Brown- yes, Cappel-yes, Johnson-no. Motion passed.

Burns thanked all of the public commenters.

4. Executive Session to Discuss Personnel, Pending Litigation and/or Land Acquisition Pursuant to Idaho Code §74-206. There was no executive session.
5. Adjournment. Davis motioned to adjourn. Cappel seconded. All in favor. The motion passed and the meeting adjourned at 10:53am.
